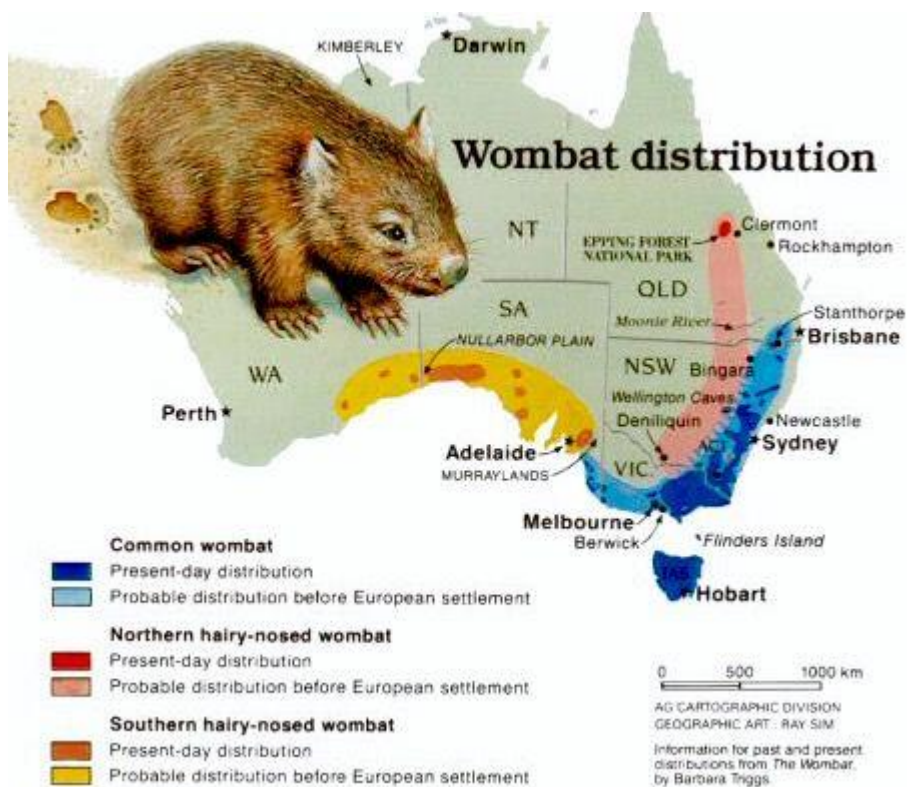


Wombat Distribution Map.



Of the three species of wombat, the Northern Hairy Nosed Wombat is critically endangered with only around 200 individuals left, the Southern Hairy Nosed Wombat survives in only small areas and is now counted in just some thousands of individuals.

Our so called “Common” or Bare Nosed Wombat is no longer common and is disappearing fast, lost to more than two thirds of the territory in which it used to be common. That loss is accelerating due to habitat loss, predation, mange caught from foxes (which luckily is now treatable), roadkill and cruelty of a few humans. The map shows the past and current distribution of the three-wombat species.
